



iTunes Store Podcast Directory

What is XML?

eXtensible Markup Language. The format commonly used to create a subscription link to podcast content on the Internet. XML is stored in plain text format with a .xml extension and it serves as a basic syntax that can be used to share information between applications, a variety of computers, and between different organizations.

What is RSS?

Real Simple Syndication. A method for making content on the Internet (podcasts, web pages, etc.) available to subscribers through feed readers. The iTunes application is one example of a feed reader.

Where do I find info about the iTunes RSS Feeds?

Here you will be able to find out specific information about iTunes Directory Categories, specification about what file types Apple allows to be included in the RSS feed, etc.

Next steps

1. Highlight and Copy the template XML text from the link above,
2. Open a New XML file in Dreamweaver (or open a plain text editor),
3. Paste the template XML text into this file,
4. Edit the text for your specific Podcast show and episode information leaving the template XML tags in place.

Page 2 of this handout shows the basic parts of the XML file.

How do I submit a Podcast to the iTunes Store Podcast Directory?

1. Open the iTunes application,
2. Navigate to the Podcast directory,
3. Click "Submit a podcast" (shown at right),
4. Type in the absolute URL link to the .xml file,
5. Click Continue and Sign in with a valid iTunes Store account.

You will get two emails within a few days from iTunes:

1. iTunes Store Podcast Created Successfully Notification,
2. iTunes Store Podcast Approved Notification

Next steps

1. Create a "Subscribe to this Podcast" link on a web page,
 2. Put the following HTML code between the <head> and </head> tags to "light" the RSS feed indicator in the browser:

## How do I update the iTunes Podcast Directory after I update my XML file with a new episode?

You will have to ping the iTunes Directory so it will refresh your directory episode listing after updating/saving your .xml file using a URL that Apple will provide to you. After pinging the directory your listing will update within a couple of hours.
